



DANIEL S. BERMAN, M.D.

SCCT President

An educator and practitioner of cardiovascular medicine, imaging and radiology for over 30 years, Dr. Daniel S. Berman is the consummate representative and leader of the Society of Cardiovascular Computed Tomography (SCCT). He possesses a well-rounded knowledge of multiple imaging modalities, not limited to CT, which led him to serve as the founding vice president of SCCT in 2005. Drawing upon his professional background and expertise, he is an activist for the accessibility and proper utilization of cardiovascular CT (CCT) in diagnosing heart disease and the advancement of CCT technology.

Dr. Berman is director of cardiac imaging at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles, California. He is also an attending physician in the departments of imaging and medicine and co-director of the Artificial Intelligence in Medicine Program at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. Dr. Berman has been a professor of medicine at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA since 1981.

In addition to being a leader in the organization of SCCT, he is also a founding member of the American Society of Nuclear Cardiology and has served on several committees for the American College of Cardiology, including the government relations committee, the live programs working group (LPWG) and the education committee. He sits on the Institutional Review Board for Research in Human Subjects at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center and is a member of the Radiological Society of North America.

An accomplished speaker and writer, Dr. Berman lectures extensively in the U.S. and abroad. He is the co-author of over 300 original peer-reviewed research manuscripts. He is also the co-author of five books on cardiac imaging and nuclear cardiology, as well as over 110 book chapters and 25 editorials. He serves as an associate editor for the *Journal of Cardiovascular Computed Tomography*. Additionally, he is a member of the editorial board of the *Journal of the American College of Cardiology*, *Cardiology Today* and the *American Journal of Cardiac Imaging*.

Throughout his career, he has been the recipient of several prestigious awards. Every year since 1993 he has been recognized as one of the Best Doctors in America by American Health Magazine. In 2000, the American College of Cardiology recognized his many years of service as a medical professor by presenting him with the Gifted Teacher Award .

Dr. Berman received his B.S. in medical sciences with honors from the University of California, Berkeley in 1966 and his M.D. from the University of California, San Francisco in 1969. Following that, he completed an internship at UC Davis as well as residencies in internal medicine and nuclear medicine and a fellowship in cardiology at the Sacramento Medical Center/UC Davis School of Medicine, where he also served for three years as faculty.
